Many capsizes, both upwind and downwind left competitors wet and laughing. Twelve races were sailed in both course fours with an offset and the second race of each set was a course three, finishing teams to windward - some of the shifts made finishing interesting to say the least.

Competitors were reminded that at the end of the day there is only your honor. There were at least four incidences where competitors either didn't exonerate for contact. There were several where competitors chose to only do one tack and one jibe instead of two tacks and two jibes. In addition there were examples of several mark roundings where competitors hit the leeward mark aware of it and chose to ignore it. Borrowed boats and facilities are always graciously lent but hosts become wary to host again when competitors make blatantly poor decisions. Competitors at the end were asked about the rules in several situations and it was apparent that they knew the correct answer and accompanying response. Luckily no damage was reported nor found to date.

Thanks to George from MDI who was chosen to be the NESSA rep and did yeomen's work with the redresses filed as well as maintaining contact with all coaches.

Thanks also to all of MSST. We just got our docks and boats into the water two weeks ago due to lack of water from no snow. They ran all shore services including scoring on the RC boat and on shore, repaired one breakdown on the water, moved marks and manned the grill. We also sailed in the event.
