1. CALL TO ORDER by President Chris Crane at 1032

2. REPORTS:

A. Secretary's Report – Rob Hurd

- a. Minutes from the November 2020 NESSA Annual Meeting have been displayed on the NESSA website since November 2020.
- b. Based upon by-laws, any Regular Member school that has paid 2021-2022 dues and is in attendance has voting privileges for this meeting. (See attached list)
- c. A New Member School may request a change of status from New to Regular Member if they meet the requirements as listed in Section I; Article C: Membership of the By-Laws. The following schools have requested a change in status and the Secretary/Treasurer stipulates that they are in good standing and recommends a vote to affirm the change in status to Regular Member.
 - At this time, no New Member School has asked for consideration
- d. Attendance is being taking in the Chat. Make sure you put your name and school name in the chat. If you did not sign in when you arrived, please make sure you do before departing.
- e. As of November 5, 2021, NESSA membership stood as follows:
 - Active Members 68
 - Pending Members 1
 - Members last year 60

Dues payments are due by the Annual Meeting.

- f. Correspondence: All official correspondences are done via the website and the NESSA list-serves. Each school is responsible for checking the website and ensuring they are on the list-serves. Information for how to subscribe to the list-serves is on the website.
- g. Tech Score:
 - Each school in responsible for ensuring that their Tech Score info is accurate and posted in a timely manner. Information posted after the close of the regatta is subject to a penalty (10 pts./div in a Fleet Race) in accordance with ISSA PR.
 - Also, pleases see ISSA PR 1.2 (a) regarding competitor's being named in the database before being eligible to compete.

h. Probations:

 - Bank Balance is \$15,461.33 as of November 5, 2021
 - PayPal Account \$129.80 as of November 5, 2021
 - ISSA dues check for ten schools has not been sent (\$1,000)
 - Fall Host sites have not been reimbursed
 - There are a few double-dues payments that need to be refunded
 - These funds include \$9,000 worth of Baker/NIT ticket deposits from the 18 schools listed below,
 - It is expected that 2021-2022 membership will increase from last year, but perhaps not to the levels of 2019.
 - Given the uncertainty, the 2021-2022 budget has not been prepared yet. Every effort will be made to balance the budget.



C. VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT - Jonathan Harley & Andrew Burr

SPRING 2021

No Championship Regattas were held in Spring 2021, instead there were national qualifiers for the Baker and the Mallory.

<u>1. Baker Qualifier</u> – May 9. Brunswick school (5-1) and Green Farms Academy (3-3) beat out Falmouth HS (ME (1-5) to secure the two NESSA Berths at the Baker.

<u>3. Mallory Qualifier</u> - May 22: Tabor Academy (89), St George's School (97) and The Hotchkiss School (114) beat out five other schools to claim the three NESSA berths at the Mallory

4. 2022 NESSA Single-handed Championship (Healy Trophy)

LIYA 6_Saturday, September 25: Multiple races were started but none were completed for the ILCA 6 Division on day 1 of the 2021 Healy Trophy thanks to a tricky southeasterly that never fully settled in.

Sunday, September 26: After completing zero races on day 1 of the 2021 Healy, sailors in the ILCA 6 division were blessed with a moderate westerly to start the day that gradually escalated into some full-on hiking conditions that made for a total of eight races with compelling action.

This one came down to the wire at the top of the fleet with two-time defending champion Chapman Petersen of The Hotchkiss School winning a tiebreaker with The Brunswick School's Ben Sheppard thanks to a bullet in the final race. That's three for three at the Healy for Chapman to cap off his time racing Lasers in NESSA. Weston High School's Antonio Henri Maya-LeFort rounded out the podium finishers with an impressive performance.

Many thanks go to Norwalk Yacht Club, particularly their Sailing Director Sean Palizza for hosting a fantastic championship event. The many parents and coaches that volunteered to help run the races deserve thanks as well. Special recognition goes to the parent volunteers from Fairfield Prep, Lincoln Academy, and Portsmouth Abbey who helped Sean and Regatta Chair Henry Millette run the RC boat on both days.

Note: LOP penalty has been changed in the new ISSA PR to +10 pts, but Tech Score has not been adjusted yet. Anyone with a LOP penalty should have 10 pts subtracted from their score.

LICA 7 Saturday, September 25: Multiple races were started but only one was completed for the ILCA 7 Division on day 1 of the 2021 Healy Trophy thanks to a tricky southeasterly that never fully settled in. Duncan Craine of Weston High School took the bullet on Saturday with Harrison Stevens of Greens Farms Academy and Robbie Upton of Fairfield Prep not far behind.

Sunday, September 26: After completing just one race on day 1 of the 2021 Healy, sailors in the ILCA 7 division were blessed with a moderate westerly to start the day that gradually escalated into some full-on hiking conditions which led to eight races being run over the course of day 2.

The action at the top of the fleet was incredibly exciting, with Harrison Stevens of Greens Farms Academy taking the championship thanks to a bullet in the final race that put him one point ahead of Weston High School's Duncan Craine. The duel between these two throughout the weekend was a joy to watch and incredibly impressive, as the winner of each race was always one of them. Olin Guck of Barrington High School took the third spot on the podium after a fantastic performance which saw him finish ahead of either Duncan or Harrison on multiple occasions.

C. PRESIDENT'S REPORT - Chris Crane

The 2021 Spring season in NESSA started out cautiously with many schools requiring their athletic teams to compete only in state vs in state opponents. Things began to loosen up in May as COVID began to wane with schools beginning to cross state lines to compete, but COVID greatly affected our NESSA qualifying and championship regatta's participation.

None of the NESSA Championships were held in the Spring. The Baker qualifier had diminished participation of only three teams competing for two berths. The Mallory qualifier had only eight teams competing for three berths. Competing schools were required to submit a permission form along with registration stating if the team qualified the school would allow them to travel to the out of state event.

Despite small numbers at NESSA events, the goal going into the season was getting kids out onto the water. Practice and meet schedules required flexibility as many schools were in a hybrid learning model and the inevitable quarantine scenario altering all of our rosters on a daily basis.

I would like to thank all of the coaches, parents, and students for embracing the situation and getting your teams sailing. I personally found it more fulfilling than usual coaching spring 2021.

NESSA'S ISSA board representatives (Rob Hurd, Jonathan Harley, Roy Williams and myself) can report ISSA is in solid financial shape and was able to hold National Championships for both teams and fleet racing.

The ISSA board continued its work to position ISSA as a mature organization by having all districts adopt an LLC structure. There are a few reasons the ISSA board pursued this change; to provide all of us in high school sailing a layer of liability protection in case of bad behavior or an unfortunate injury. The pursuit of sponsorship deals may be more successful and also allow an increase in insurability limits as some of our college venues for events now require increasing coverage.

Thank you, Rob Hurd, for doing the work of two people. Thank you, Jonathan Harley and Andrew Burr, for keeping race operations and the opportunities they provided. Apologies to NESSA scorer Carl Zimba for not much action in our team racing season.
